Chadwell Heath

Valence House Museum

The only surviving manor house in Dagenham, it dates back to Medieval times and is still partially surrounded by a moat.

Eastbury Manor

Built between 1560 and 1573, Eastbury Hall, as it was formerly known, was built for Clement Sisley and his growing family. This rare example of a mid-16th-century brick-built Gentry house tells an extraordinary story of survival.

Royal Air Force (RAF) Museum

Hundreds of artefacts reflecting the history of Barnet and those that have lived there, dating from the Bronze Age to the present day.

Crossness Pumping Station

Built in 1865 by Sir Joseph Bazalgette as part of Victorian London's sewage

system, Crossness Pumping Station is a Grade 1 Listed industrial heritage site and a masterpiece of 19th-century engineering, architecture, and design.

Hall Place & Gardens

Grade I listed country house built in 1537. A rare example of its type, many of the original features remain today.

Grade I listed Palladian villa built by Sir John Boyd in 1766 for his second wife Catherine Chapone, Danson House was originally designed by architect Sir Robert Taylor (who was also the architect of the Bank of England).

Iconic Arts and Crafts home of William and Jane Morris and the centre of the Pre-Raphaelite circle. The garden is an oasis in urban outer London.
